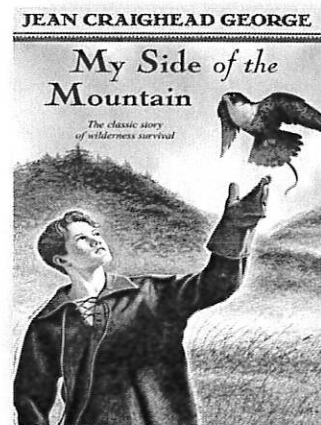


Summer Reading Assignment For Rising 6th Graders

My Side of the Mountain

Comprehension Questions: Chapters 1,2,3 Pages 3-24

How does Sam learn survival techniques for the wilderness?

Sam catches five nice trout but ends up crawling into his hemlock tent hungry, cold and miserable. Why?

Explain how Sam finally learns to make a fire.

How does Sam find information about the Gribbley farm?

Who does Sam write a letter to, and why? What happens to the letter?

Describe how Sam's second night in the Catskills compares to his first night.

When Sam can't catch fish, what does he eat? How does he get them?

As Sam explores the Gribbley farm, what does he note with "x's" on his sketch, and why?
